Jesus Family

Jesus Parents

Summary

We know some details about Jesus' family. His mothers' name was Mary. She was married to Joseph. Joseph was not the actual father of Jesus but adopted Him upon His birth.

Jesus was conceived of the Holy Spirit. Joseph was prominent only in the accounts surrounding Jesus' birth, flight to Egypt, and return.

He is mentioned in the story of Jesus and the Temple.

We know nothing of the circumstances of Joseph's death. There may be a hint of his death before the public ministry of Jesus in the words of Simeon. He was not around when Jesus entered His public ministry. Mary is mentioned on certain occasions during Jesus' ministry.

Mary was a virgin when the angel announced to her that she would give birth to the Messiah. She figures prominently into the birth narrative of Jesus.

There are only a few other occasions where she is mentioned. She is at the wedding of Cana of Galilee when Jesus turns the water into wine. Mary is also with Jesus' brothers and sisters when they wish to speak with Him apart from the crowd.

She was there at His first miracle, attempted to take Him aside at one point, and was there at His crucifixion.

She was taken into the home of the Apostle John after the death of Jesus.

The last mention of her in the New Testament is before Pentecost where she is together with the other disciples.

Jesus Brothers and Sisters

Did Jesus have any brothers? If so how many?

Bible Verses about Jesus' Brother and Sisters

Let us first sum up what we know from the New Testament of the brothers and sisters of the Lord.

They are mentioned in

Matthew 12:46-50, 13:55-56; Mark 3:31, 6:3;

Luke 8:19; **John 2:12**, 7:3;

Acts 1:14; 1 Cor. 9:5; and

Paul speaks of a James the Lord's brother (**Galatians 1:19**).

Of the brothers, there seem to have been four who are named in **Matthew 13:55**: James, Joseph, Simon, and Judas (see **Mark 6:3**).

Matthew 13:53-58 New International Version A Prophet Without Honour

⁵³ When Jesus had finished these parables, he moved on from there. ⁵⁴ Coming to his hometown, he began teaching the people in their synagogue, and they were amazed. "Where did this man get this wisdom and these miraculous powers?" they asked. ⁵⁵ "Isn't this the carpenter's son? Isn't his mother's name Mary, and **aren't** his brothers James, Joseph, Simon and Judas? ⁵⁶ Aren't all his sisters with us? Where then did this man get all these things?" ⁵⁷ And they took offense at him.

But Jesus said to them, "A prophet is not without honor except in his own town and in his own home."

⁵⁸ And he did not do many miracles there because of their lack of faith.

Matthew and Mark mention the sisters, but neither the number nor the names are given.

From the language of the Nazarenes (<u>Matthew 13:56</u>, "His sisters, are they not all with us?"), there must have been at least two, probably more, and apparently married, and resident at Nazareth.

These brothers and sisters are not mentioned at all until after the Lord began His ministry and are first mentioned as going with His mother and Himself to Capernaum (**John 2:12**).

It is in dispute whether any were believers in His Messianic claims, at least until the very end of His ministry (**John 7:3-10**).

Most say that they were made believers through His <u>resurrection</u>, as they appear in company with the Apostles (<u>Acts 1:14</u>).

In all the references to the Lord's brethren several things are noticeable:

first, that they are always called brothers and sisters, not cousins or kinsmen; **second,** that their relationship is always defined with reference to Him, not to Joseph or to Mary; they are always called His brothers and sisters, not sons and daughters of Mary;

third, that they always appear in connection with Mary (except in **John 7:3**) as if her children, members of her household, and under her direction.
