
The church also has a team of Elders who prayerfully carry out the pastoral care of the church, a team of Deacons and a Church Administrator who look after the practical working of the church.

WHO WE ARE:

We are a Baptist church associated with the Baptist Churches of NZ. The Fairfield Baptist church was planted on its present site in 1955.

WHAT WE BELIEVE:

MINISTRIES OF OUR CHURCH INCLUDE:

Sunday morning service: 10:00am for worship and Bible teaching relevant to the challenges of today's world. Messages are available on the church website at www. fairfieldbaptist.co.nz.

Children's Church and Youth Bible Study run concurrently with our service.

Prayer:

- 9:00am each Sunday to pray for all aspects of our service & for new people/visitors.
- 7:00pm each Monday evening in the chapel to pray for the various aspects of the life of the church.

Classic Service: 5:00pm on 3rd Sunday of each month in the upstairs lounge for much loved hymns, a great message, and communion with shared finger food tea.

Missionary Group (BMF): Meets regularly to pray for, and promote interest in overseas missionary activities.

Craft Group: Regular outreach activity. For friendship, fellowship, learning & creating a range of different crafts.

Indoor bowls: An afternoon activity in the church hall for friendship and meeting new people. A great opportunity to bring others along.

Woman2Woman: A ministry to FBC women & beyond. Held 3-4 times a year with interesting & fun activities. Everyone welcome.

Community Lunches: Fortnightly during school terms—advertised locally & on noticeboard. This ministry is growing rapidly as folk from the community come along, enjoy a home cooked meal & fellowship with others. \$3 per person.

ICONZ: A programme in partnership with Boy's Brigade for boys aged 8-11 yrs and 11-14yrs. Meeting each Monday night from 6:30pm-8:00pm in the church hall during school terms.

Social Youth Group: Information about our social youth group available from the office.

Blokes Ministry: The "Finishing Well" Blokes ministry, meet together for brekkie at Rototuna McDonalds to chat, fellowship and pray together. 1st Saturday each month.

Small Groups: We have a number of small groups operating weekly for prayer, fellowship, and gathering around the word. Details of these are available in the church office.
